A Letter from the Board Chair

Dear Friends, Supporters, and Community Members,

As we reflect on FY24, we are filled with gratitude for your unwavering support of our neighbors in need. With roughly 3,000 families and 3,900 students seeking support each week, the FFO giving community is the driving force behind our ability to care for those experiencing food insecurity.

This year was marked by significant growth, dynamic development, and transformative shifts. We welcomed a new Executive Director, Deb Haynes, to the team, distributed over 3.8 million pounds of food into the community, and evolved our programming while serving as a bridge to other essential community resources. In January 2024, we witnessed an unprecedented surge in demand, serving more individuals than at the height of the pandemic and welcoming over 400 families to our pantry almost daily.

Unfortunately, we face a difficult year ahead. With a reduction in County and Federal funding, coupled with the expiration of ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) funding, the food assistance safety net in Fairfax County is strained. Hunger remains a persistent issue in our community. We are calling on you, the backbone of our giving community, to be an advocate for our neighbors in need. Every penny, every minute, every moment counts and makes our impact possible. Together, we are stronger. Thank you for standing with us in the fight against hunger!

Navigating THE Rising Need

The last few years have been marked by significant changes for Food for Others, as we have adapted to the evolving needs of our community. The COVID-19 pandemic initially drove a surge in demand for food assistance, and the need has persisted, reflecting the ongoing economic challenges faced by many in our community. From our region's high cost of living to the impacts of rising inflation, families are continuing to struggle to make ends meet. The pandemic had an undeniable impact on Food for Others, shaping many of our current programs. The community support we received during the pandemic allowed us to expand as the need grew. It was directly due to community support that enabled us to open My Market in January 2023, grow our Power Pack Program to reach 3,900 students weekly, and expand our list of partner agencies, providing food to more of our neighbors in need.

This increased need for food has remained high following the end of the pandemic. Compared to pre-pandemic (2019), we have seen a staggering 250% increase in the number of families we serve. While economic hardship is a common factor, the reasons why families seek our assistance vary. There is no one-size-fits-all for food insecurity or the reasons why families visit our pantry. Opening My Market has helped us reach a broader range of individuals in need and provided us with the opportunity to expand our available food, adding more culturally diverse options and more produce. As our programs expanded, word quickly traveled in the community.

Surprisingly, the busiest month at Food for Others did not align with the peak of the COVID-19 pandemic. In January 2024, well after the state of emergency ended, we served over 400 people a day. Even now, My Market often sees over 250 people a day – many of whom are new individuals and families seeking food assistance. Another driving force behind Food for Others' increase in food distribution is the rising cost of groceries. When comparing May 2020 and May 2024, the cost of groceries increased 22.6%. Rising prices for essential groceries have made it difficult for many families to afford healthy, nutritious meals. This has led to a growing number of people relying on food assistance programs to supplement their food budgets.

Looking ahead, we anticipate a sustained demand for assistance. As we adapt to this new level of need, our community's support is essential to our mission. From supporting our My Market expansion to volunteering their time, every individual plays a vital role in our impact. As we look toward the future, we remain committed to our vision of a community free from hunger and food insecurity. We'll continue to adapt and innovate to ensure that everyone has access to the food they need to thrive.
