# Empowering our Community One Choice at a Time

## A Letter from the Board Chair



For many, the heart of the home is the kitchen. Full of warmth, nourishment, and memories, this room becomes a safe space for so many. At Food for Others, we strive to provide that safe space to our neighbors in need.

We believe no one should be forced to choose between putting food on their table and other crucial needs, such as rent or childcare. For more than 70,000 people in Fairfax County, this choice is their reality. Though the country is moving closer to pre-pandemic norms, the need for food assistance in our community has yet to decrease to pre-pandemic numbers. Just as hope was on the horizon, the impact of inflation hit across the country – impacting not just our clientele, but also the broader community.

In March 2023, the end to the COVID-era emergency allotment of SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) benefits caused our neighbors to take an additional hit. More than 25,000 families in Fairfax County felt the impact of these changes, some receiving up to \$250 less in support each month.

Despite these and other challenges, FY23 was filled with growth. Our activity throughout the year focused on increasing equity and a sense of belonging for our clients. Guided by client feedback and led by our community, our intentional decisions led us toward building a stronger Food for Others community. Some FY23 accomplishments include:

- Re-introducing a choice marketplace, My Market, to our community to provide our clients with a welcoming grocery store-like experience and empowerment center;
- Constructing a Volunteer Hub to provide our volunteers with a comfortable gathering and orientation space;
- Piloting a food delivery program with DoorDash's Project Dash Program;
- Increasing the amount of fresh produce purchased from local BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Color) farmers;
- Introducing additional services to our community through existing and new community partnerships;
- Growing our Power Pack Program to serve 3,900 students a week throughout the school year, an 18% increase from FY22, across 45 Fairfax County Public Schools.
- Reducing the amount of food waste in our community by switching to a choice model in our pantry, and by partnering with eight new grocery stores;
- Increasing the amount of culturally appropriate foods provided throughout our programming.

As we move forward into FY24, we are excited to continue expanding our Food for Others community, including welcoming Deb Haynes as our new Executive Director. Thank you for being part of the Food for Others community and standing with us in the fight against hunger. Together, we can continue to build a food secure future in Fairfax County.

## Mobile Sites

# Empowering Choice

## The Impact of My Market

Among the aisles of My Market, choice, dignity, and compassion intersect. Opened in January 2023, My Market offers a new style of food distribution centered around client choice. When walking into My Market, you immediately notice something different – the inside replicates a grocery store. Food lines the shelves as clients walk through with shopping carts, selecting food they prefer and putting it in their carts. By 9:00 AM, Food for Others is already filled with excitement from volunteers and clients alike.

The heart of Food for Others lies in our community. By utilizing a choice model, we are not just supporting our community but empowering our clients. Clients have the autonomy to select their items, tailoring their choices to their unique dietary requirements and family preferences. This approach respects the rich diversity of our community, ensuring the food provided is not just nutritious, but also culturally appropriate. In a world where so much can feel out of control, My Market supports personal empowerment and choice.



When building the space, we prioritized creating an accessible environment where everyone has equal access to our resources. Input from clients was a pillar of My Market's construction – taking feedback from the previous choice market and implementing changes that cater to the needs of our community. Our goal was to create a sense of belonging for everyone that visited Food for Others. Individuals with different physical abilities are able to access our space for the first time in our 28 year history through our ADA-accessible ramp. There is always a Spanish speaking staff member available to ease some language barriers and hesitation based on communication. We have curated a space focused on our client's needs and dignity. The welcoming environment incorporates trauma informed colors and staff who are trained in Mental Health First Aid. The support for this new distribution is evident. Since making these changes and opening My Market, our client satisfaction has increased by 18%.

This expansion is a testament to the incredible community of Food for Others. My Market began as a concept, expanded to a conversation and, through community support, became a reality. Many vital Food for Others community members came together and donated their time, experience, and guidance to make this dream a reality. A plaque graces the entryway of



My Market, recognizing the hundreds of hours of project management that Rosenthal Properties contributed to help create My Market. Amid the 10,000 ft. of warehouse space leased by Fairfax County, we have the space to feed hundreds of families each day. The shelves that fill our market were all generously donated by Wegmans Food Markets and the refrigeration was generously installed and maintained by Air Engineers.

In addition to food distribution, My Market allows us the space to expand our community support. Parents with young children can receive diapers, a budget-breaking expense in many households, through the Fairfax Diapers program. While parents check in, older children can peruse the bookshelves of My Market, taking home books donated by Books Are Food for Your Brain. The impact of My Market extends beyond the realm of food distribution. My Market serves as a community resource, a hub where our clients are comfortable seeking assistance. We've been

able to expand our support by collaborating with other organizations to offer additional resources, such as SNAP and WIC enrollment, financial literacy, healthcare, and so much more. As we look toward the second year of My Market, new initiatives are developing. Philanthropic aid such as the Philip L. Graham Fund supports our operational growth - helping us meet a broader scope of community need.



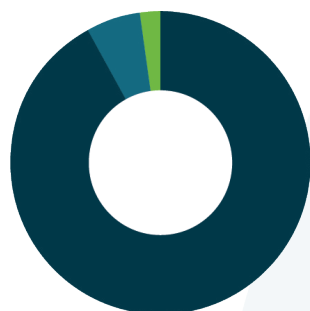
